- 1. Present the evolution of translation studies. Try to point to the beginnings of the discipline and its consecutive stages.
- 2. Define the concept of 'translation' as it is presented by theoreticians of the discipline in relation to the types of translation activity and the types of texts.
- 3. Present the main principles of the Skopos theory in translation studies. Point to the weaknesses of the theory.
- 4. Discuss the concepts of 'correspondence' and 'equivalence' in translation studies. Are they equivalent or do they stand in opposition to each other?
- 5. Discuss the concepts of 'coherence' and 'cohesion' in translation. How do they correlate to the concept of 'shifts'?
- 6. Present the translation strategies of domestication and foreignization. Discuss them in relation to such concepts as: cultural values, loss or adherence to dominant literary canons.
- 7. Discuss the distinction between 'qualitative'/'quantitative' methods in research. Try to illustrate their significance in translation studies.
- 9. Explain the concept of 'norms' in translation behaviour by presenting Toury's view on translation.
- 10. Present the stages in audio-visual translation approach by concentrating on some chosen mode, i.e. subtitles or voice-over.
- 11. Discuss the issue of sensitive issues in the translation process: enumerate some of them and specify the difficulty involved in dealing with such matters.
- 12. Discuss the concepts of 'faithfulness', 'spirit' and 'truth' in the translation process. Are they complementary or mutually exclusive to one another?
- 13. Discuss the concepts of 'dynamic' and 'static' translation in relation to a literary text. Point to the main advantages and drawbacks of each approach.
- 14. Elaborate on culturally-loaded vocabulary in the translation process and how related it is to the issue of equivalence.
- 15. Explain the meaning of the term 'untranslatibility.' Present different types of untraslatability and the means of overcoming it.
- 16. Assess the difficulty in audio-visual translation on the basis of some chosen AVT mode, i.e. voice over, subtitles or dubbing.
- 17. Explain the term 'cultural turn' in translation studies. Present the movement's main view on the role of cultural processes and systems of signification.
- 18. Explain the concepts of 'localisation' and 'globalisation' in the field of translation studies. How do the two concepts relate to the areas of business and industry and their 'products'?
- 19. Present the 'word-for-word' and 'sense-for-sense' dispute in translation studies. Point to the main adherents of the two approaches as well as their strengths and weaknesses.
- 20. Discuss the market restrains affecting the quality of translation. Elaborate on the translator's role, the publishing houses demands or the translator's self awareness.
- 21. Discus the usefulness of Vinay and Darbelnet's model of translation strategies and the subsequent methodologies. Try to include in your presentation the Polish theoreticians' typologies.
- 22. Explain the concept of 'ideology' and its significance in translation. How important is it to understand its role in text and is it possible to remain neutral while translating?
- 23. Discuss the role of the translator in relation to such concepts as: 'visibility' and 'ethics'

- 24. Explain the concept of 'pragmatics' and its relationship with translation studies. Provide some examples.
- 25. Define the concept of 'figurative language'. How is this area of language catered for by the translators?
- 26. What does devolution mean in the British context and how does it impact the United kingdom?
- 27. Define the concept of 'stereotypes', their type forms in media portrayals. What are the most visible present day media stereotypes?
- 28. Present the Mass Society theory and its basic tenets on individual and identity.
- 29. Discuss the distinction between qualitative/quantitative methods in cultural studies.
- 30. Define the terms: 'popular culture' and 'high culture'. How do they relate to social divisions and hierarchy?
- 31. How do you understand the concept of 'ideology' in media products? Is its understanding essential in people's life?
- 32. Define the concept of post-modernism and its manifestation in the present day media.
- 33. Why is the meaning of 'a sign' constructed differently in various cultures? What are its components?
- 34. Define the concept of subculture, its functions and attributes. Are subcultures still vital in the modern world?
- 35. What do 'power' and 'address' have to do with the way meaning is produced by media?
- 36. Present the basic concepts of semantic theory and their relevance in cultural studies.
- 37. Define the field of cultural studies. In what way is it interdisciplinary and innovative?
- 38. Define the field of media studies, its diversity and dynamism. Why is it important to understand this communication sector?
- 39. Present the Uses and Gratification Theory. In what way its audience-centred approach can explains the way the present day media function?
- 40. Explain the concept of 'ideology' in Cultural Studies. In what way does it relate to socially significant groups of people?
- 41. Present the basic concepts of semiotics used in Cultural Studies. How does semiotics facilitate interdisciplinary studies?
- 42. Explain the concept of 'a cultural code'. How does it relate to systems or symbols?
- 43. Explain the concepts of the 'Otherness' and 'Norm'. How do media use them in their reporting?
- 44. Which literary genre, biography / autobiography,/ travel book should be more appealing to readers considering such subjects as experience or identity?
- 45. How significant are autobiographical acts, among them coaxer/coercers in understanding an auto/biography?
- 46. Enumerate some types of autobiographical writing. Present their essential features and main focus.
- 47. In what way are 'memoir' and 'autobiography' distinct? Which of them tends to be more authentic?
- 48. Define the field of 'genre studies'. What are its main concerns/considerations?
- 49. Discuss the genre of the Bildungsroman and its influence on autobiography.
