

ECTS Grading Scale

The ECTS grading scale is an auxiliary grading scale adopted in the European Credit Transfer System, which facilitates the translation of grades obtained by a student at one university (i.e. according to the grading scale applicable at that university) to the grading scale of another university. It does not replace the grades awarded by a given university according to its own system, but only provides additional information on the student's work. Institutions decide for themselves how to apply the ECTS grading scale to their own system.

ECTS Grading Scale at Pope John Paul II State School of Higher Education in Biała Podlaska:

Polish grading scale	ECTS Grade	Definition
5.0	A	EXCELLENT - outstanding performance with only minor errors
4.5	B	VERY GOOD - above the average standard but with some errors
4.0	C	GOOD - generally sound work with a number of notable errors
3.5	D	SATISFACTORY - fair but with significant shortcomings
3.0	E	SUFFICIENT - performance meets the minimum criteria
2	F	FAIL - some more work required before the credit can be awarded
