Call for papers

Theme

The fundamental forms of organizing the educational process both at school and at academic levels are based on individual learner and group work as well as whole-class instruction. Different types of learner interaction not only play a role in the complex dynamics of relationships among discourse participants but also ensure achieving educational goals. The need for limiting traditional teaching in favour of distant teaching that has arisen due to the spread of the Covid 19 pandemic has led theoreticians and practitioners to reflect more deeply on the advantages and disadvantages of these two instructional frameworks, with hybrid teaching appearing to be a way out.

This conference, which is devoted to the issue of organizing individual and group work in traditional and online education, is addressed to scholars in the area of pedagogy, psychology, the didactics of school subjects and glottodidactics, as well as to practising teachers of curricular and academic subjects at all levels of the education system.

We welcome contributions related to the theme of the conference in a form of the participant's choice, such as PowerPoint presentations, also those with recorded commentary, or videos (15-20 min.), as well as papers already prepared for publication. There will be a possibility of asking the presenters questions via e-mail during the course of the conference.

The participation in the conference is free and does not require presenting a paper. In order to join the conference you are requested to fill in the registration form before the conference begins.

The languages of the conference are: English, Polish, and Russian.

The organizers of the conference suggest that the topics given below be referred to. However, raising other issues related to the theme of the conference is also welcome.

1. Comparing the features of traditional and online instruction in terms of aspects such as goals, models, implementation, results, evaluation, and testing

- 2. Teaching school and academic subjects, foreign languages, as well as content and language integrated learning (CLIL) in schools and in higher education institutions
- 3. Searching for innovative teaching techniques and designing new didactic materials
- 4. Using new technologies in achieving didactic, educational, and protective goals, including key competencies at different educational stages
- 5. Accomplishing complex goals in the area of humanities, social, technical, and natural sciences at different educational stages
- 6. Teaching exceptionally gifted and special needs learner
- 7. Individualizing the process of teaching and tutoring in traditional, distant, and hybrid instruction (e-learning platforms)
- 8. Learner and teacher autonomy, motivation, and demotivation; the role of learner age and gender; and teacher personality
- 9. New (and not new) phenomena determined by distant learning: globalization, technicization of instruction, limiting the subjectification of the individual, adiaphorization of human interrelationships
- 10. Impact of children's family situation on the outcomes of online learning

Submission of a proposal

Abstracts (up to 250 words) should be sent as .doc, .docx or .pdf files to <u>nauczanietradycyjneizdalne@pswbp.pl</u> by 15th September 2021. Please save the file under the following name: **proposal_yoursurname_yourname**. In the case of co-authored papers use the following format: **proposal_surname1&surname2**. The proposals will be peerreviewed and the notification of acceptance will be sent by 25th September 2021.

Publication

The papers intended to be published should be sent to the conference address <u>nauczanietradycyjneizdalne@pswbp.pl</u> by 20th December 2021. If reviewed positively, they will be chosen for publication in a monograph at Wydawnictwo PSW JPII (80 pts.) or in a refereed journal *Rozprawy Społeczne* (assigned 20 points by the Polish Ministry of Education and Science).

The publication fee is 200 PLN. Please make your payment by the 30th January 2022 to the conference account.
